From Daisies to Awards....with Fiona Reuter




Last year, however, Fiona decided she would like to compete and so she enrolled in the CJGA Junior Linkster Tour. She entered a few tournaments, had fun, won a couple - one of which she had the best score overall, even beating the boys. But the biggest win, for both Fiona and her parents, was winning the season's "Most Sportsmanlike Golfer" for her age group!

This year she is playing in the Junior Linkster Tour again and she's played in two Maple Leaf Junior Tour events. She's had one win and the season has only just begun.

At first, Georg would give her an occasional mulligan and they progressed from playing 9-holes up to 18-holes and now it is a totally different story.
